- 4. Be willing to stand alone.





The Importance of Keyboarding Skills

Proper keyboarding techniques are essential in today's computer-based world. With state testing now being completed entirely online, keyboarding skills are imperative. Observations indicate that students with even basic keyboarding skill are more relaxed during testing as they are able to concentrate on the test rather than the typing component.

We ask that 3rd-8th students begin <u>daily</u> keyboarding training practice. Start with 10 minutes per day. Make it a fun family challenge. You'll be surprised at how quickly typing fluency will increase with daily practice.
